Ex-Eagle Turns On The Heat!

For years, the Eagles soared on top of the country rock perch, but in 1980 they landed for good. Soon after, however, each took separate flight and solo efforts abounded. One of the more successful was Glenn Frey—once famous as the voice of such Eagles' tunes as "Hotel California" and "Lyn' Eyes." Glenn grabbed an entire new league of fans with his solo works: "I Found Somebody" off his debut *No Fun Aloud* and "Sexy Girl" from *The Allnighter*.

Both were applauded by critics and fans alike, which doesn't surprise Glenn all that much. "My songs grow on people," he says, then goes on to joke, "(just) like warts."

One of his songs, "Smuggler's Blues," really grew on *Miami Vice's* executive producer who liked it so much he created a whole episode based on the lyrics. The show also marked Glenn's acting debut, adding another item to his list of accomplishments as singer/songwriter/guitarist/producer.

In solo flight, Glenn is back on top—his contribution to the *Beverly Hills Cop* soundtrack, "The Heat Is On," promises to keep him there at least until he's ready to release his third LP. When that happens, you can be sure Glenn will again "take it to the limit, one more time."
